Interjections are words or phrases that express emotions of surprise, joy, anger, greeting, approval, attention, sorrow or similar things.

Some of the words used as interjections are:

Oops, ouch, wow, hey, well, ahem, hooray, great, sigh, alas, cheers, exactly, bravo, well done, listen etc.

Interjections can be punctuated using a comma, exclamation mark or a question mark

Example: - Listen,

Wow!
