

Apostrophes

The apostrophe has two main functions:

- 1) to show possession of a noun
- 2) to show the omission of letters

- add 's to the singular form of the word (even if it ends in -s):
I live near my teacher's house.
I like Alexis's toys.
- add 's to the last noun to show joint possession of an object:
I like Stella and Anita's school.
