

A **Pronoun** is a word used in place of a noun or of more than one noun.

**Example:-** The school student accepted the certificate proudly. He had worked hard for it.

The **pronoun** He takes the place of the noun student. The pronoun it takes the place of the noun certificate.

There are several kinds of pronouns:

- **Personal** (which includes the possessive and reflexive forms)
- **Relative**
- **Interrogative**
- **Demonstrative**
- **Indefinite**
