

An adjective is a describing word. It tells you more about a noun. Normally an adjective appears before the noun and sometimes after the noun.

- A smart boy
- A large computer
- It is hot
- John is an extremely quiet boy
- Madagascar is an amazing movie to watch
- My father was very happy with his car's speed.

Adjectives describing Size:

Enormous, massive, large, wide, high, long, tall, small, short etc.

Adjectives describing the Age:

Ancient, elderly, teenage, youthful, old, aged etc.

Adjectives describing appearance:

Awesome, nice, glamorous, fantastic, good, elegant, funny, fat, dirty, calm, dull, precious, silly etc.

Adjectives describing Colour:

Violet, indigo, blue, green, yellow orange, red etc.

Adjectives describing the Shape:

Circle, oval, triangular, rectangular, flat etc.

Adjectives describing Feelings:

Pleased, delighted, elated, broken, deflated, demoralized, angry, excited, frightened etc.

Adjectives describing the Quantity:

One, two, three, four, five, first, second, light, significant etc.

Adjectives describing the Condition.

True, real, dead, alive, important, strange, open, closed etc.

Adjectives describing the Time:

Early, punctual, short, long, late, traditional, young etc.

Adjectives describing Weather:

Hot, cold, sunny, rainy, foggy, dusty etc.

Adjectives describing Material:

Bronze, plastic, khadi, woolen, wooden etc.

Adjectives describing the Nationality:

Indian, Russian, Thai, African, Indonesian, American etc.

Adjectives describing the Taste of touch:

Delicious, juicy, sweet, tasty, slippery, smooth, rough, wet etc.

Adjectives describing the Purpose:

Playing, sleeping, driving, etc.

Adjectives describing the Sound:

Loud, quiet, whispering, thundering, hushed, moaning etc.
